



Project Name: Relative (Dance)







 $IAm\ All\ Of\ Us$, The Docuseries & The Publication, expands the South East Archive (2016 — 2023); archival project of stories, interviews and photographs of local artists and community members from South East Naarm (Vol.1), and surrounding suburbs (Vol.2 & Vol.3). Through quality time, meaningful conversations and listening, Sol & Maru continue their seven-year journey of documenting the voices and stories of family, community members, artists and creatives from all walks of life through film, photo and text.

I Am All Of Us, The Short Film, revisits certain quotes and memories from The South East Archive (2016 — 2023) and weaves these specific moments into a narrative-based short film about identity; creation, disruption & overcoming. Seven interdisciplinary artists have developed creative site responsive works that draws from their lived, intergenerational and contextual experiences at the former Springvale Migrant Hostel. Artists will draw from their experience and relationship to the site; now a retirement village. Works include poetry, visual arts, painting and socially engaged works. As part of the project: artists, family, friends and community along with current residents were invited to gather at the site, walk through the space, eat together, connect and share stories with one another. There was a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony. The works will also be documented and uploaded to <u>Archiving the Present's website</u> as a growing, living archive of decolonial memory practice and embodied forms of archives that do not confirm to colonial forms of remembering.

To Casey, from Kabul is a series of eight environmental portraits of men and women from the Afghan Hazara community who have migrated to Casey and their contributions in the community with important stories to share. In this series I have photographed four men and four women whom I have known for the last few years and their stories and works has also inspired me personally. Over the past few years, I have noticed how Afghan Hazara diaspora across the world have come to know Casey as a significant hub for our community. When Afghans visits Melbourne, many will say that they feel like they are at home while in the boundaries of Casey – it feels just like Kabul. I believe that by documenting stories, the boundaries between members of the Hazara community and wider Casey community will be lifted as we can all be inspired to make positive changes in our lives and both local and global communities.
